Sunbelt Pan Americanism and Gendered Liberalism in the
Alliance of Pan American Round Tables, 1944-1964



In October 1944, women from the United States, Mexico, Honduras, and Costa Rica met in Mexico City, establishing the Alliance of Pan American Round Tables. During a luncheon at the Club Americano, the well dressed, respectable

women posed for a photo – a moment of promise and excitement captured in film. This paper traces the activities of the Alliance from 1944 to 1964, establishing the significance of Texas in post-World War II U.S. foreign policy towards Latin America.
