Therefore, be it resolved that the Student Government Association of the University of Houston:

That the Student Government Association is in support of maintaining the University of Houston's dedication to maintaining an environmentally sustainable campus through the utilization of a campus-wide ban of Styrofoam products offered at all campus dining franchises;

Be it further resolved, that the Chick-fil-a franchises located in the Student Center South and Student Center Satellite are urged to cease the use of Styrofoam products and switch to a non-Styrofoam alternative for cups.
