All submissions should be no more than two single-spaced pages (inclusive of references cited according to the <u>APA 7<sup>th</sup> Edition style</u>).

## **Peer-Review and Ethics**

CFJ Editorial Board is committed to peer-review integrity and upholding the highest standards of the review procedure. All submissions will be emailed to the Editor-in-Chief to assess suitability. The qualified works will then be sent to anonymous reviewers. After the peer-review complete, the editorial board will send comments and result to the authors. Once the new issue is published, the editorial board will send the publication information to the authors.
