In this role, you will build and strengthens relationships within the team to enhance the collaboration among agencies who partner with our Children's Advocacy Center (CAC). The CAC started in 1997 and serves over 4000 children and families annually and is comprised of a team of about 22 professionals and clinicians. We provide an array of services (all free of charge) including forensic interviews, victim and family advocacy, medical referrals, therapy/mental health services, case coordination and criminal court advocacy. All services are offered in English and Spanish. We operate under a Multi-Disciplinary Team model where we collaborate with 40 partner agencies.
