Bachelor of Arts students must have documented foreign language proficiency at the second semester of 2000-level or higher in one foreign language. \*Satisfactory completion may require up to four (4) terms of sequential level coursework. Students with foreign language competency may satisfy part of or all of this requirement by placement or by credit by examination.

### **Transfer Credit Limit**

**A maximum of 66 hours (grades C- or better) of 1000/2000 level transfer hours may be applied toward a UH degree.** These are the 66 hours that best meet the degree requirements for your UH degree combination (Major, Double Major, Double Degree, and Minor).
