Theory and Aural Skills Proficiency Examinations:

Upon admission to the program, all students must complete proficiency exams in Music Theory, Aural Skills, and Piano. Proficiency exams are prerequisites for several courses in the theory and aural skills sequences. Furthermore, proficiency examinations are valid only through the next offering of the course for which they are prerequisite; if a student, having qualified for a course for which a proficiency examination is prerequisite, fails to complete that course the next time it is offered, the student must retake and pass the proficiency exam(s) for that course before enrolling in it. Applied studio placement is determined by performance in audition.

Transfer Credit Limit

A maximum of 66 hours (grades C- or better) of 1000/2000 level transfer hours may be applied toward a UH degree. These are the 66 hours that best meet the degree requirements for your UH degree combination (Major, Double Major, Double Degree, and Minor).
